Water Conservation

We are experiencing extremely low rainfall in our region compared with previous years. Did you know that Pennsylvania uses an average of 62 gallons of water per person per day? A simple dripping faucet can waste 10 gallons of water every day if not addressed.

The Campmeeting urges Members to enact the following water conservation measures:

- Only run the washing machine or dishwasher with full loads.
- Always remember to turn off the water while you brush your teeth.
- Take a shorter shower. The average shower is 8 minutes; aim for 5.
- Be sure to fix leaks and running toilets when you first notice them.
- Water your plants in the cool of morning/evening. And only water larger areas if it is necessary.
- Skip washing your car at home (116 gal) and head to a car wash that uses 16.2 gal on average.
