SURVEY MEMBERSHIP



- **❖** MGCA Association Member Survey Results
 - Drafted & deployed to Association Members—January 2018
 - 171 responses; 71% response rate

- * Response(s) confirmed board assumptions . . .
- **Common themes throughout responses/comments...**



- **❖** Most <u>important</u> to Association Members:
 - Being respectful to neighbors
 - Communicating with Association Members about emergencies
 - Managing tree canopy & natural environment

Scored 89% of member response for all three categories



- **❖** Most Pressing Challenge(s) Facing the Campmeeting—The Top 5:
 - Addressing infrastructure issues
 - Maintaining history & uniqueness
 - Blighted properties
 - Traditions & values
 - Enforcement of rules



- ❖ Additional Comments from Association Members—The Top 5:
 - "No Comment" (question left blank)
 - Enforcement of rules
 - Respect community values & history
 - Noise pollution
 - Garbage dumpster availability



- ❖ Concern with Renters/Number of Rental Properties:
 - 53% of respondents—not concerned about rental properties
 - Top 3 reasons cited:
 - > Rental properties "afford" accessibility
 - > Rental properties raise community awareness
 - > Renters become owners; a "community investment"



- ❖ Concern with Renters/Number of Rental Properties:
 - 47% of respondents—cited concerns about rental properties
 - Top 3 reasons cited:
 - > Understanding the rules
 - > Loss of history & values
 - ➤ Noise & alcohol
- * Are these concerns unique to individuals who <u>rent</u> cottages?
